In July 2024 I had the honour to organize with the precious help of Amrita a two-day Dances of Universal Peace event in Darwin. It has been held at the beautiful Lakeside Community Garden,





where it also served the purpose of promoting the no profit activities of environmental sustainability of it.

We had the pleasure to integrate in the event two workshops run by Lia, a mixed aboriginal woman who holds profound plant knowledge: the first one on how to make bamboo dream catchers targeted for families, the second one on “Seed saving and propagation” for adults.

We shared dances, nourishing afternoon teas and lovely chats. We had Susan

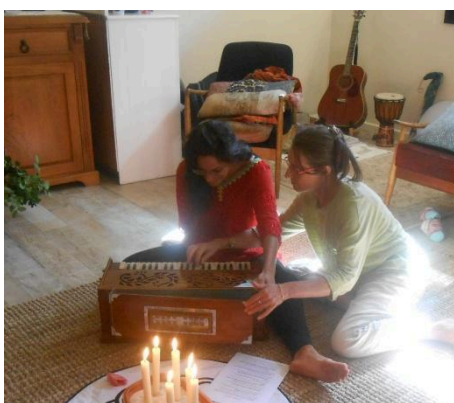


coming from SA, Heidi coming from Queensland and a few

more people from Darwin and from the Garden. It was the first time anything like that has been organized up here and I am still reflecting on which one may be the best way to introduce DUP to the local communities.

In January I joined a residential retreat weekend in SA, “The elements of Mastery”, offered by Amrita, where I had the opportunity to deepen my practice, musicianship and connections with the lovely people who attended.
